

About Our School

Allen Avenue Elementary School, built in 1951, is a neighborhood-based school which houses kindergarten through grade four. The kindergartens are half-day morning and afternoon programs. There are two sections of grades 1, 2, 3, and 4. There are currently 222 students. Of those students, 113 are boys and 109 are girls. The average class size is 22.2.

The Allen Avenue School has a library, computer lab, and a cafeteria/gymnasium. The parent-teacher organization, called the A.A.P.T., is very active in fundraising and organizing school-based events. Our school has two "Golden Rules":

- I will follow directions the first time given.
- I will keep my hands, feet, objects, and unkind words and gestures to myself.

The North Attleboro Elementary Schools' curriculum has been aligned with the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks. Our most recent NCLB Report Card reported that Allen is a "Very High" performing school in ELA and a "High" performing school in Mathematics. Special Needs programs include Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Counseling, ELL services, and a Resource Room (pull-out and inclusion). Reading Recovery is provided for grade 1 students.

Allen Avenue School has a staff of experienced teachers, all of whom are licensed in his/her teaching assignment. The school's principal is in his first year as principal at Allen Avenue, previously serving for two years as Vice Principal of the Joseph W. Martin Elementary School in North Attleborough. Prior to coming to North Attleborough, he was an elementary classroom teacher in the Newton Public School System for eight years.
